In a creative effort to continue reaching as many youth as possible while we can't be together physically, Trips for Kids Marin partnered with Girl Scouts Heart of Central California to host our first virtual Learn it, Fix it, Shred it program culminating in the earning of a good sportsmanship merit badge. Adam, our Trail Rides manager, and RJ,

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eight attending girl scouts how to properly complete a personal safety check, fit their helmet correctly, and complete an ABC Quick Check on their bikes. Many of the girls had their bikes and helmets on hand for the video call and were following along, practicing Adam and RJ's advice in real time.



At the end, the girls scouts were

given a few goals to strive for including: riding five miles, embodying good sportsmanship, and practicing their new skills. If they complete their goals, they will earn the good sportsmanship merit badge! During the closing 'circle', a few of the girls shared new things they had learned. Their answers included how to put a chain back on the chain ring and the names of different bike parts. All had a good time and were looking forward to riding their bike after the program. After the successful first run, we hope to offer this program on a regular basis until we can meet again on the trail!


